President's Letter

Land Conservation Rooted in Our Community

This town is amazing for the breadth of its support of conservation, rooted in the special nature of this community we call home for some or all of the year. Our attachment to "place" is one of the most meaningful parts of our lives. It is expressed in how *much* we want Little Compton to change *little*. Land conservation is one form of fulfilling that wish.

Why should any of us care? Because landowners who give up the right to either sell their land for development or develop it themselves are entrusting this organization and others with the perpetual protection of their property. In exchange, we all benefit from these gifts of open space that make Little Compton unique. Wildlife and native plants can thrive. Water resources are protected and remain resilient during times of drought. A low level of development allows us relief from the expense of publicly-subsidized infrastructure for water and sewerage — we each have our own. We have remarkably intact scenic vistas on a number of our roadways. And there are lands continuing to be used for historic agricultural purpose.

I've noticed how few places I once cherished draw me back. Many that were special for their quiet and remaining sense of wildness or history have been altered beyond recognition. Here, through luck, close attention, persistence and dedicated conservation we have managed to hold on to some semblance of these things, fragile as they are. The responsibility of honoring and passing them on is ours.

We've been talking a lot about transitions and transformations at SPA lately. As a result, we will be professionalizing the management and stewardship of our holdings with a part-time staff position this year, ensuring we meet the obligations we take on with each of our acquisitions and continue FOREVER.

With your membership supporting our efforts, we work passionately to keep this place one we all wish to return to from wherever we travel. Thank you for making it possible! $-Abigail\ Brooks$
